

Hand-Foot Syndrome

What it looks like



What it feels like

Mild (grade 1)

- Numbness and tingling
- Painless redness and swelling
- You are still able to do your normal activities

Moderate (grade 2)

- Painful redness
- Swelling
- It is difficult for you to do your normal activities



Call your nurse.

Severe (grade 3)

- Peeling of skin
- Ulcers (sores) and blisters
- Severe pain
- You are not able to do your normal activities

You may have these symptoms on your hands and feet.

If you have a problem or concern about a symptom or side effect from your cancer treatment:

1. Call your primary nurse at the cancer centre from Monday to Friday, 8:30 am to 4 pm, (except on holidays). Use the phone number your primary nurse gave you.
2. Contact CareChart Digital Health from Monday to Friday, 5 pm to 8:30 am and anytime on weekends and holidays for symptom management support.
